Winter Tree Identification

Wednesday, December 6, 2023 at 7 pm

Winter is a great time of year to see the trees beyond their leaves. Buds, stems, and bark all have their own stories to tell. Learn how to look at them and use these characteristics to identify some of our more common trees in Maryland. We will discuss terminology and apply them to a few species you are likely to see in your local forest. We will then practice winter tree identification through a dichotomous key example.

Join Bradley Simpson is the Restoration Manager for Nature Forward where his work in this field has included research as well as active management of urban forests. He has conducted urban forest research in


